

Tree Planting at San Juan del Centro Affordable Housing Community



Saturday, May 10 has been selected as the date to plant trees at the San Juan del Centro affordable housing community. Boulder Rotary and Boulder Valley Rotary provided \$2,500 to the Tree Trust Program of the Play Boulder Foundation to purchase the trees.

We're still not sure exactly how many trees this may buy, depending on the size, but we're hoping to put in at least 10 trees this year. This will be in addition to the 6 trees that were planted last year. We plan to start work at 9 am in the morning and continue until the trees are planted, mulched and watered. Play Boulder Tree Trust staff will maintain the trees through the summer by watering and pruning. It is recommended the volunteers bring and wear gloves and suitable clothing for this type of work.

Flatirons Habitat for Humanity House Construction



Join us on May 17, 2025, roll up your sleeves and make a lasting impact! This year, we're taking action at Ponderosa Mobile Home Park, a community near West Four Mile Canyon Creek that is undergoing a transformation to ensure affordable, sustainable, and safe housing for its residents. Since its purchase by the city in 2017, extensive infrastructure upgrades have been underway, and now, in partnership with Flatirons Habitat for Humanity, we are constructing highly energy-efficient, fixed foundation homes that will serve families for generations to come. Volunteers will contribute at one of two locations:

- Ponderosa Construction Site Assist in building homes directly on-site.
- BoulderMOD Factory Work on prefabricated home components that will be installed in the Ponderosa community.
